Journal Description

The Journal of East Asian Affairs, sponsored by Institute for National Security Strategy (INSS), is a peer-reviewed journal that is published biannually. The Institute is a non-profit organization founded in 1977 in Seoul, South Korea and was restructured from the former Research Institute for International Affairs. Currently, the INSS has a diverse group of resident analysts, many of whom have been trained in the United States, Europe, East Asia, and other areas of the world, and has been publishing The Journal of East Asian Affairs since January 1981. The Journal is dedicated to the development of policy recommendations and theoretical frameworks in fields such as East Asian international relations, emerging security and geopolitics, and inter-Korean relations. It has approximately 1,800 subscribers worldwide, including academics, government officials, and journalists, and is accessible worldwide in the libraries of major universities and research institutes.

The Journal welcomes the submission of manuscripts and review articles associated with East Asia. The Journal's scope includes inter-/intra-regional conflict and cooperation; traditional and non-traditional security threats; geopolitical transformation in the region; economic security issues; and inter-Korean relations. Contributors are encouraged to engage both theoretically and empirically with their subject material. The Journal does not adhere to any specific policy line or methodology and seeks to establish more sustainable conflict resolution for global society.
